The Stanford in Washington Art Gallery is hosting ***Festival des Artistes: Diplomacy Through Art***. This exhibition of paintings, photography, jewelry and ceramics showcases the amateur and professional artistic talents of Washington's diplomatic community. The exhibit runs from January 25 until March 22 at 2655 Connecticut Ave.

The National Park Service proposes to rehabilitate a 3.7-mile section of **Rock Creek Trail** from Broad Branch Road to M Street, including a 3,000 foot segment of the Rose Park Trail, and a spur along Piney Branch Parkway from Beach Drive to Arkansas Avenue. An Environmental Assessment and Assessment of Effects will be prepared to analyze the potential impacts of a range of alternatives on the natural, cultural and human environment. There is an informational public meeting to present the alternatives under consideration for inclusion in the EA at National Zoo Visitor Center on Wednesday, February 23 from 6 to 8 pm.
