WPCA is looking into improving/enlivening the edge of Rock Creek Park at the southwest corner of Connecticut and Calvert. If you have an interest in working on the project (no particular experience necessary), please let me know.

Last month, the Deputy Mayor for Education released a report that described three "policy options" for **DCPS district boundaries and feeder patterns**. One of the options would change the schools that children would attend after going to Oyster-Adams and John Eaton. At its meeting last week, the WPCA Executive Committee agreed (pending additional input from members) that it would advocate against these changes and for retaining the existing feeder patterns for both schools. Still have your **old trash and recycling containers**, waiting for the city to pick them up? DPW now says that it is conducting a "[citywide blitz](#)" (starting yesterday) to remove the unwanted cans.
