Woodley Park News

A couple of weeks ago, we asked for your opinion of the proposal by the owner of the **McDonalds** near the Woodley Park Metro to redesign the exterior of the building. Your response was overwhelmingly negative, and this week the WPCA Board voted to oppose the plan, which must be approved by the Historic Preservation Review Board. Drawings of the proposal are <u>on the website</u>. If you haven't responded already and want to tell us what you think of the proposal, please let <u>me</u> or <u>any member of the WPCA Board</u> know.

Much of Woodley Park, generally from 29th St east to Rock Creek Park, was designated an historic district in the 1990's. At an Historic Preservation Review Board hearing in July, members of the Board suggested that the community might want to review the more-than-twenty-year-old historic district design guidelines to see if they still reflected its desires. The issue that prompted the suggestion related to the amount of protection to be given to the rear of houses in the historic area, but the review would not be limited to that question. The WPCA Board voted this week to initiate such a review. If you are interested in participating in this process, please contact Barbara loanes.
