CM Nadeau has introduced a bill that would significantly change DC's historic preservation law. First, It would make building height irrelevant when deciding whether proposed construction is compatible with a historic district. It would also allow a property owner in a historic district to build out to the maximum density allowed by zoning rules without regard to historic compatibility. With only a couple of months left in this Council Period, it's unlikely that this bill will move this year.
