The Office of Planning is working on a new **Comprehensive Plan** to guide DC's growth and development for the next 20 years. OP's draft will ultimately go to the Council for approval. A piece of that plan is the Future Land Use Map, which does not by itself change zoning classifications, but provides tells the Zoning Commission what changes might be appropriate. (It was a FLUM change five years ago that prompted the current proceeding to rezone Connecticut Ave.) OP released its [first draft of a new FLUM](#) last week, in which nothing changes for Woodley Park.
